<p>17: Katie Brown Educational Program has been happening at Diman with all freshmen students. The Women’s Leadership group at Diman has also received a four-session relationship violence prevention training from The Women’s Center. A similar group at Durfee also received this training. The Suicide Coalition has had two programs – Understanding the Complex Puzzle of Non-Suicidal Self-Injury with 202 in attendance including teachers. SACs, SRAs, agency members, community members, DCF staff, DMH staff and others. We also convened a World Café on Stigman and convened a subcommittee to look at the stigma of mental health as well as other issues – 78 people attended. We had a men’s evening and Mass men.org to discuss the issues of men and mental health with 18 men attending. TH FRSPC has also sent three adjustment counselors, one police officer, two community members and two graduate students to training on the warning signs of suicide and how to engage in conversation with youth that have suicide ideation.</p>

We had WAVE groups for at risk girls at both Diman and Durfee for both semesters. We had a series of 5 workshops on Micro Aggression and Implicit Bias for high school youth. We ran 6 Confronting Discrimination Group that included both adults and youth in the discussions. We held a workshop in the evening before Peace by Piece for anyone working with at risk youth with attendance of 27. We had a brief training for staff before the start of Peace by Piece with 31 adults.</p>
